

I have seen numerous researches by my title manager reflecting open or expired permits on houses being readied for closings. Roofers seem to be the most notorious. When a job is being done on your property under a county permit, there are several permit inspection points assigned to that activity. The last one is the most important.

When the contractor is finished on the job, he just wants his money and then moves on to the next job. You need to hold final payment until they furnish you this SIGNED OFF copy by the Hillsborough County Permit Department. It's always wise to advise them that you will be doing this before you finalize the contract for work to be done.

You don't want to walk into the closing with an open permit. Chances are your buyer would not close. To get a general contractor to close out the permit will cost between \$400 and \$1,000 minimum plus 3 or 4 weeks. Remember, the government doesn't care when your house gets closed. You get in line, and when it's your turn, they'll respond.



## Connor Leach — Keeping an Eye on Lake Carroll's Water Quality

While our CRD keeps a monthly check on the water quality for swimming at White Sands Beach, there is a more extensive water testing that takes place monthly through LAKEWATCH.

LAKEWATCH is coordinated through the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences/SFRC Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences. The Florida LAKEWATCH program has been in existence since 1986. In 1991, the Florida Legislature recognized the importance of the program and established Florida LAKEWATCH in the state statutes (Florida Statute 1004.49.). LAKEWATCH is now one of the largest lake monitoring programs in the nation with over 1,000 trained citizens.

Our local trained resident is Connor Leach, 18, of Carrollwood Drive. While staying busy as a varsity baseball and basketball player, this class president at Berkeley Preparatory School enjoys his time on the lake tubing and boating with friends.

"I drive a boat out to specific coordinates on the water and collect data on algae growth, water clarity, and boat pollution. After gathering the samples, I perform various tests on the water collected. For example, I filter the water through specific paper bacteria netting and record bacteria levels. I then freeze the water samples and deliver them to a collection center. From there, they are taken to Gainesville for further testing." says Leach.

"I was eager to jump on this opportunity, admittedly, at first, for the community service hours. The ecologist from UF drove down, gave me the equipment and taught me how to collect and test the samples, and explained why this monthly testing was necessary to track water conditions ecologically. After

why this monthly testing was necessary to track water his visit, my perspective changed! This has been a great how both natural and unnatural occurrences affect our to collect and record data effectively as I help to protect our I enjoy being a part of a much bigger picture and understand that my actions are my way of ensuring that my habitat remains healthy both now and for generations to come. My mom grew up in this neighborhood when this was the outskirts of town. I want to make sure this area stays as pure as it can be in the coming years."

So, how is our water? Lake Carroll is 221 acres and very healthy! All nutrient levels fall safely within the ranges for oligotrophic lakes and have been since Lake Carroll records began in 1992. How to keep our lake clean? Dispose of trash properly – especially cigarette butts! Grass clippings can clog storm drains and deliver hazardous fertilizer and pesticides to the lake. Dispose of them properly. Pet waste spreads bacteria and diseases – so keep that out of the lake and storm drains too! Boaters should remove all plant parts from the motor, trailer, anchors, and fishing gear to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Are you interested in LAKEWATCH and doing monthly testing? Connor is a senior and will go off to college this fall and will need to pass this torch on to another willing resident in the near future.
