As we move into the warmer weather of spring and early summer, the anticipation of another season enjoying Lake Carroll and the various amenities of our beautiful neighborhood are constantly on my mind. But I am also pondering a long forgotten Carrollwood tradition, and I am grateful for the opportunity to remind everyone of what election years used to mean to our residents.

I have surfed through a lot of old *Carolers* from the '70s and '80s, and recall seeing many announcements of a dozen or more residents vying for one of the nine seats on the Carrollwood Recreation District Board of Trustees. The last contested election occurred in the mid-'90s, about 20 years ago. Is it time to resurrect this tradition? That is up to you.

If you've had thoughts of serving your Community as a Trustee on the CRD, did you know that you must either be elected or appointed? When the CRD was created, the elections process was intended to be the primary method of joining the Board. The appointment process was only intended to be used when less than nine residents signed up for the election. If you are interested in serving during the 2015-2016 term, there are some key deadlines in May and June of 2014. So now is the time to prepare for the election, even though it is not held until November.

The election process is not governed in any way by the sitting Board of Trustees. It is entirely under the jurisdiction of the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections. Interested residents are not required to inform or receive the approval of the sitting Board in order to qualify as a candidate.

For complete information on how to qualify for the 2014 election, visit the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections website at <http://www.votehillsborough.org/?id=60>. But I am taking this opportunity to share with you a brief overview of the qualifying process.

There are two methods of qualifying for the November ballot. Candidates can submit a petition with at least 25 other resident signatures by noon on May 19, 2014. If you use this option, you must also pay a nominal fee of 10 cents per signature. If you choose not to solicit signatures on a petition, you can pay a \$25 fee during "qualifying week," which is between noon on June 16, 2014, and noon on June 20, 2014. All petitions and fees must be submitted by the resident directly to the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections office by the deadlines noted.

All candidates, regardless of which method of qualifying they choose, must also submit a few other documents during qualifying week. Blank forms of all necessary documents can be found on the Supervisor's website.

Once you qualify for the ballot, your name will be posted as a candidate on the Supervisor's website immediately after qualifying week. Your candidacy, as in past elections, becomes public information five months before the actual vote. Every aspect of this process is subject to all public disclosure laws. If 10 or more candidates qualify for the ballot, then it will be a contested election and will go to a vote in November. If nine or less candidates qualify, then all of the candidates will be automatically elected and our election will not appear on the ballot.

At our April, May and June meetings, we will provide copies of the blank forms needed for the election qualifying process. Also during those meetings, there will be time set aside to ask questions about serving on the CRD Board. Any interested residents should consider attending one or more of those meetings to find out more about Board service. These Q&A sessions will only be intended to inform you about the commitment that Board service demands. Although we may discuss the qualifying

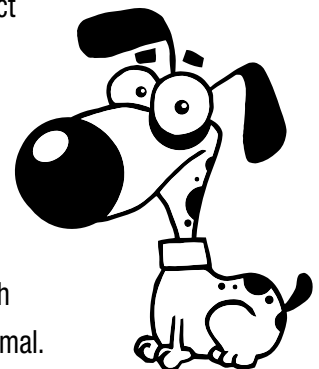

Dogs and cats must be under the direct control of the owner or keeper. "Direct control" is defined as the immediate, continuous physical control of an animal at all times; such as by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of such strength to restrain the animal.

In essence, what this tells us is that the market has improved considerably. Homes under \$250K are moving very well. When they exceed \$250K, the demand is less;

primarily because there are fewer people capable of financing in those areas. This data has been developed by the Greater Tampa Board of Realtors.

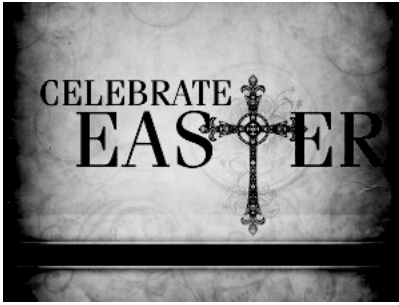

Nourish, Enrich, Strengthen

Meals on Wheels of Tampa

It was my privilege to attend the Annual Meals on Wheels of Tampa (MOW) Breakfast at Higgins Hall held on March 6, 2014, as a guest of Amy Shimberg. I first met Amy when she was President of the Carrollwood Elementary School PTA and I served as Secretary in the late 1960s. Her friendship through the years has been warm and delightful. The breakfast was a very nice affair telling the story of MOW through the eyes of the recipients. Every individual had a heartwarming story reminding us of their needs. MOW began in March, 1975, the effort of many churches and civic organizations in the area. MOW furnishes hot, nourishing meals five days a week to the homebound enabling them to stay in their own homes. The food, prepared fresh daily by MOW in its own commercial kitchen, is planned and cooked on site by a professional chef using healthy seasonal ingredients. MOW delivers more than just meals. Many of our seniors live alone without social contact. A smile and conversation from a volunteer are often the highlight of their day. MOW Tampa is available for long-term or temporary meal assistance. While most of the recipients are senior citizens, I remember one young recipient who had been in an automobile accident with her husband. Often, a recipient's family lives some distance away. MOW reassures families their loved one is checked upon with eyes and ears. People from all economic backgrounds are served. Hunger is not confined to the poor. Half of all at-risk seniors have incomes above the federal poverty line. One-third of recipients pay full price for the meals, 1/3 reduced price, and 1/3 receive meals at no cost to them. Financial support truly helps those in need. MOW receives no federal, state or tax monies of any kind and is

funded by churches, civic groups and individuals. Eighty-five cents of every dollar donated in 2013 went directly to programming.

MOW was founded by Gloria Fuentes, a Tampa resident experiencing

difficulty when caring for her two homebound relatives who lived on opposite sides of the city. Recognizing the need to assist not only her family, but also others who wanted to remain independent in the security of their own homes, she formed a committee made up of several pastors and church members throughout the city to help organize the effort. On March 18, 1975, MOW began with a group of dedicated volunteers who cooked meals in the recreation hall of a local United Methodist Church and delivered 12 meals to homebound recipients. Amy Shimberg, Charlsie Proffitt, and Peggy Lynch were among that group of Original Carrollwood volunteers.

I started with MOW in September of 1975 with a group called the CW Service League. I dropped out for two years, 1978 & 1979. I have been a MOW volunteer since its inception except for that two-year break. I am now into my 36th year as a MOW volunteer. I restarted in 1979 with Ginny Neumeister until her health forced her stop. Roger, my husband, often helped when he was free and Ginny was unavailable. He began as a regular volunteer with me when he retired from USF, Physics Dept. in 1994. Currently we drive FH6 on 1st and 3rd Wednesdays together.

In 1993, after 17 years of helping people from the kitchens and offices of neighboring organizations throughout the community, MOW purchased the building at 550 W. Hillsborough Avenue in Tampa to house its administrative offices and kitchen.

Weekend meals are delivered frozen to the recipient on Friday and are easily microwaveable. Volunteers pick up meals at designated community centers convenient to their route. After delivering the meals, they return their containers to the designated pick-up location. On average, it takes a volunteer approximately 90 minutes to deliver the meals. In addition to the food, each volunteer is provided with a route sheet, which includes specific directions to the recipient's home. If a recipient is not home, the volunteer checks in with the office so a follow-up phone call can be made to check on the recipients well-being. There are 13 pick-up

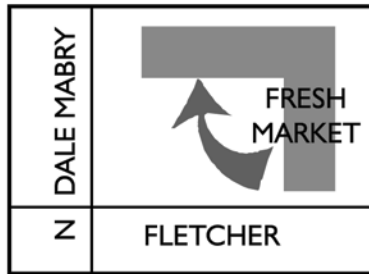

sites, 66 routes that deliver meals to approximately 750 recipients Monday through Friday. In our local area, there are two of those pick-up sites: Grace Lutheran Church (GL), 3714 W. Linebaugh Ave., 33618; and Forest Hills United Methodist (FH), 904 Linebaugh Ave., 33612. FH was once used as a satellite kitchen and has been a pick-up site since the beginning of MOW.

Based on your desire and schedule, you may deliver a route twice a month or as often as several times a week. Drivers must be 18 years of age, have a valid driver's license, auto insurance and agree to a background screening. For more information on being a volunteer driver and other opportunities, contact Taylor Kenny, Volunteer Coordinator at 813-238-8410.

MOW values the contributions of all volunteers and demonstrates their appreciation by recognizing their service at an "Annual Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon." At this event, the coveted "Amy Shimberg Volunteer of the Year Award" is presented to a volunteer who has exhibited outstanding contributions to the organization. Once you apply as a volunteer, an interview is scheduled prior to orientation and training. New volunteers are given the opportunity to train with an experienced volunteer or staff member until they are comfortable with performing the duties required for the position.
