Ct the March meeting, we had a presentation from a moms group for new playground equipment at Original Carrollwood Park. The Board did not take a position on it during the meeting, but rather listened and asked questions. Also, as a follow up from the February meeting, a resident presented pictures of a community in the Orlando area that has controlled entry to a park with a boat launch, similar to White Sands Beach. So the suggestion would be to have an entry gate that opens and closes each time a vehicle enters & exits the property. Both of these resident

suggestions come with a cost. We are now in the budget planning process for 2021-2022, so the timing was good. Some big expense projects will take anywhere from 12 to 24 months due to planning, executing, and funding allocation.

### CHAMBERLAIN HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC NATIONAL CHAMPS!!!!

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During the inaugural year of 3DE curriculum in Tampa (and launched under COVID conditions), the all-freshman 3DE team from Chamberlain High School overwhelmed the judges with their business case presentation in January and WON the 3DE National Case Competition – for client Arby's! Over 100 teams competed from twenty-two 3DE high schools across the country.

3DE schools re-engineer high school education to create engaging learning environments that reflect the world in which we live to empower students with knowledge, skills and confidence to unlock greater economic opportunity. 3DE strategically blends the core competencies of our school district, Junior Achievement and the broader business community to create an academic framework that is directly connected to the real-world.

The 3DE program was only available for ninth grade beginning in 2020-2021, and will phase in to include all grade levels within four years. The full 3DE program will grow to add tenth grade in 2021-22, eleventh grade in 2022-23 and twelfth grade in 2023-24.

## **COYOTES IN ORIGINAL CARROLLWOOD**

There are have been recent sightings of coyotes in Original Carrollwood.

#### From Fish & Wildlife Commission:

There has been recent activity with coyotes in the Greater Carrollwood area. We have contacted Florida Wildlife Commission (FWC) to answer questions that have been raised concerning coyotes in our neighborhood.

<u>The best steps are neighborhood education to reduce</u> the food source for coyotes:

Never feed coyotes either intentionally or unintentionally. This includes placing food outside to attract any wildlife. Clean up pet food, fallen fruit and seed around bird feeders - coyotes are opportunistic feeders and will be drawn to and eat all of these potential food sources. Secure garbage cans and secure compost. Close off crawl spaces

sheds to prevent coyotes and other or raising their young in areas around your home. Educate your neighbors and ask them to follow these same steps.

under porches and animals from resting

Removing/trapping coyotes from one area can result in other coyotes moving in from surrounding areas and producing more pups per litter. It is an inefficient and ineffective method to control populations. They compensate by increasing litter size and new coyotes move into areas where others have been removed. Populations can quickly return to original size. Coyotes travel several miles or more per day. If some are removed from an area, the neighboring packs will move into the area where there is a food source and take over.

Be aware of unusual coyote behavior. Examples of unusual coyote behavior include coyotes approaching people, stalking pets, chasing joggers or bikers or attacking leashed pets. Currently FWC has very few complaints for coyotes and unusual/aggressive behavior. If you notice any unusual/aggressive behavior as noted above, please contact FWC to address the situation.

## **OC Pedestrian Safety:**

Submitted by an OC Resident | The contributor has been an OC resident for more than 10 years and was formerly on the faculty of the Center for Urban Transportation Research at the University of South Florida.

We are so fortunate in Original Carrollwood to have sidewalks on each side of every street in our neighborhood for our residents to enjoy while power-walking, jogging, pushing a baby-stroller, or just walking with a friend. Pedestrians that are not using the sidewalks are putting their safety at significant risk.

Sidewalks are highly instrumental in reducing roadway and pedestrian crashes, says the US Department of Transportation. "Roadways without sidewalks are more than twice as likely to have pedestrian crashes as sites with sidewalks on both sides of the street." A report by the Governors' Highway Safety Association determined about 6,227 pedestrians in the US were killed in motor vehicle crashes in 2018 — a four percent increase over 2017 and the highest mortality rate since 1990. Florida was among the top five states with the highest pedestrian fatalities. In 2017 in the Tampa Bay Region alone, there were more than 100 pedestrian and 22 bicycle fatalities, reports the Tampa Bay Times.

To stay safe as a pedestrian:

- Obey traffic laws and walk with the flow of traffic.
- Use sidewalks whenever they're available.

• Look both ways before crossing at the crosswalks, and pay attention to traffic lights and walk signals where appropriate.

• Walk defensively, since you never know when a car will fail to stop at a crosswalk or intersection. Cyclists too, must obey traffic signals and signs, including always riding in the same direction of traffic, either on the street or in a bike lane. According to Dr. Timothy Miller, a sports-medicine specialist and orthopedic surgeon at the Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, "There's no evidence to conclude whether certain surfaces lead to fewer joint injuries." As he tells readers in an article on Self.com, "The theory is that [softer surfaces] can slow down progression of things like arthritic changes or other joint pain, but it hasn't been proven, and there has been some debate."

Livestrong.com offers this perspective from an article published in the San Diego Union-Tribune, which stated, "The surface on which you run doesn't play a significant role in most running injuries." Whatever the surface, it's mainly important your shoes fit comfortably and have the necessary support and cushion to stabilize your foot.

A report sponsored by the Federal Highway Administration notes older adult pedestrians are much more vulnerable to serious injury or death when struck by a motor vehicle than younger pedestrians. Older pedestrians also make up 13 percent of pedestrian fatalities, with both male and female pedestrians aged 75 and older having the highest fatality rate. With distracted driving at an all-time high, and driver-visibility easily impaired (through blind-spots caused by cargo, headrests, interior and exterior mirrors, vehicle height, and even the height of the driver), why risk it? Use the sidewalks!

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#### REAL ESTATE 101: Closing Sign-Off

S o, what are you going to do when you're buying or selling a home and your partner is out of town and can't get in town for the closing? There are several alternatives.

Title companies can and will overnight the documents to you via UPS or FedEx, etc. Then you can return them the same way which can all be accomplished in a couple of days. However, mortgage companies are notorious for getting their info to the title companies at the last minute which has to be at least 3 days prior to closing. That means everyone has to be in a crunch mode to get these turned around.

Another method is to have a Power of Attorney (POA) for a specific Real Estate transaction. This has to be set up usually by the title company and approved by the mortgage company. Again, mortgage companies are slow to move on these matters so that must be planned early on in the process.

The key is to recognize this at the very beginning of the buying or selling process so that time is allowed in order to meet the closing date. If there are two people involved on either side of the transaction, be aware at the beginning that these decisions have to be made up front. Otherwise, it requires changing of the contract which requires all parties to agree upon and might cause a delay in closing which can be a major factor in either the seller's moving plans or the buyer's moving plans.

Most important is how the money exchanges. If you cause the contract to slip you now affect the financial structure of the loan and corrections to many of the administrative functions.

My suggestion to you is to start off with your mortgage company to determine how much house you can handle before you begin the search. Know before you make a contract who will be the parties on the contract and then stick with that plan. Changes down the road are destructive and often create unwanted delays.
