NO GLASS OR BOTTLES



As we move into late spring and the weather warms up, the CRD Board is focused on dealing with issues related to the use of White Sands Beach and Scotty Cooper Park. At WSB, many repairs are in the works, the guard service has been renewed, and weed control measures have begun. Unfortunately, the irrigation pump that feeds the sprinkler system was stolen and the water fountains must be replaced. Our new guard is being trained to be "user friendly," and has been instructed to do his best to get to know the residents over time so that you do not necessarily have to show ID every time you go. Please be patient with the guard, especially during his first month or so as he tries to adjust to our expectations. And please,

NO GLASS at the beach. Glass bottles left in the trash cans overnight often end up broken on the walkways and in the water.

The weeds on the swim side of the dock received a chemical treatment just before Spring Break, and a particularly bad patch is being retreated as I write this. We expect to see the weeds clearing up quite a bit by the time this article is published. We have also completed weed control work at Cooper Park and have ongoing efforts to remove the Muscovy ducks from the park and the surrounding areas. The dock is now much cleaner than it has been for many years and we will reinstate removal of these ducks on an annual basis. If you happen to see Muscovy ducks in your area, it would be best if you did not feed them. An active population

can leave several pounds of excrement on a dock in just a few days creating a serious health hazard for our residents.

Vandalism has been an ongoing problem at Original Carrollwood Park and park Chairman Paul Siddall has been busy dealing with the repairs. We intend to work on improving security at the park as funds become available.

Island lighting and irrigation throughout the neighborhood is being repaired, upgraded and improved in steps. Hopefully, by the end of this year, all the islands will have full working landscape lighting and fully functioning irrigation. Some bills have appeared a bit high, and Chairman Bill Lais has been looking into the situation attempting to find a cause. During his investigations, he found that a meter that was several hundred yards outside the eastern boundary of the CRD was being billed to us. The account was closed immediately.

As I mentioned in the April *Caroler*, two key deadlines are coming in May and June relating to CRD elections. There are two deadlines because there are two different ways to qualify to appear on the ballot in November. The first is Noon on May 19th and requires submission of 25 or more completed submission forms to the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections Office. Candidates are encouraged by the Supervisor's office to submit more

Dogs and cats must be under the direct control of the owner or keeper. "Direct control" is defined as the immediate, continuous physical control of an animal at all times; such as by means of a fence,

leash, cord or chain of such strength to restrain the animal.

# OC REAL ESTATE SELLING YOUR HOME 101

## **Lead Based Paint**

In 1992, the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act was created subjecting citizens to civil and criminal penalties and



potential triple damages in a private lawsuit for knowingly violating this law. In essence, this act was created to protect individuals from the hazards of lead-based paints, which were commonly used in construction prior to 1978. Since the majority of the 962 homes in Original Carrollwood were built before 1978, it is necessary for us to disclose any knowledge that we may have of this substance being in our home.

Florida Realtors and the Florida Bar have developed documents for this disclosure that are designed to protect both the seller and buyer. They require the seller to declare knowledge or lack of knowledge of lead-based paint in the dwelling and it gives information to the buyer on the long term effects of lead exposure.

The reality is that most of us are totally unaware of the products that were used in the building of our homes and therefore will have to declare no knowledge. And, of course, most of us have painted our homes several times since 1978 so the paint has been covered over. Still, you must declare something. Your Real Estate agent should certainly be aware of this requirement and can help you file the proper documents that are needed to close the deal.



# **Staying Safe on the Water**

National Safe Boating Week runs from May 17-23, 2014. Yet as residents of a lakefront community, safe boating practices are a priority each day of the year.

Carrying proper safety and communications equipment and familiarizing yourself with navigational rules are just two ways to increase your preparedness. Even paddleboards are subject to safe boating requirements and rules about safety gear. The list below is intended to help ensure smooth sailing throughout the summer boating season.

Always wear your Type III, Coast Guard approved life vest and ensure you have one onboard for each passenger. The Coast Guard estimates that 80 percent of boating fatalities might have been prevented if boaters wore their life jackets. Many people assume that merely having life jackets onboard is sufficient. However, there may not be time to grab one when an emergency arises. There are many low-profile and self-inflating life vests available making it easy to stay comfortable and safe simultaneously. For tips: http://www.safeboatingcampaign.com/instructional.htm

Always be prepared: file a float plan. Know your vessel and all your emergency equipment. If you are venturing out in open water, file the float plan so that when an emergency strikes, vital details will be readily available to rescuers that may help save your life. You can download a form, conduct some pre-trip planning, chart a course and list emergency contacts. Essentially, that's enough detail to improve your chances of being rescued safely and quickly. Sharing information about your route also helps rescuers locate you when overdue.

Check the weather and marine conditions before heading out. It's wise to check the currents, tides, winds and storm predictions before heading out and to check for updates during your trip. Watch for lightning and hurricanes and unexpected summer squalls that may crop up unexpectedly. Don't assume it is safe to ride out a tropical storm or hurricane in your boat.

**Take 15 minutes to conduct a pre-departure check list**. Taking the extra time before heading out, ensures that all equipment is in good working order.

Have safety equipment in good working order. That includes:

- An Emergency Positioning Indicator Radio Beacon (EPIRB) compatible with a GPS-enhanced Global Positioning System (GPS) allows military aircraft and satellites to detect your position, even if you become incapacitated. Registering your equipment and keeping your information updated is critical.
- A personal EPIRB can attach to your life vest and can send out this information even if you become separated from your vessel.
- Have a VHF/Marine band radio in good working order (cell phones may not be reliable offshore and batteries are often inefficient when wet).
- Carry flares, a whistle or air horn, signal mirror (or other visual distress signal).
- Have a working fire extinguisher onboard.
- Boats greater than 16-feet long must have a life ring or cushion that can be thrown overboard.

**Get a free vessel safety check before heading out on the water.** Knowing what's required ahead of time can improve your safety. The United States Coast Guard Auxiliary offers a comprehensive vessel examination ranging from registration numbers to inspection of ventilation, fuel tanks to safety equipment (including fire extinguishers, personal floatation devices, visual distress signals, and inflatable rafts). It's designed to improve your vessel safety knowledge and confidence. Founded in 1939, the all-volunteer Coast Guard Auxiliary dedicates significant resources to vessel safety and boating education each year.

Familiarize yourself with the vessel you are using before getting underway. Taking a few moments to understand the way your vessel operates can increase your knowledge and confidence and help avoid unsafe situations while on the water.

# Lake News

Navigating Original Carrollwood can be daunting enough without construction. However, the county is working to keep Lake Carroll clean and algae free. Below is an explanation from the county concerning construction in front of Scotty Cooper Park. The road closure projects started on 3/17/2014 should end on 5/9/2014 for construction of both baffle boxes. One is now under construction and a second will be at the intersection of Carib Road and Lake Carroll Drive.

"The county is working on the construction of two baffle boxes as pre-treatment of the water quality enters to Lake Carroll. Baffle box is to remove most organic matters; i.e., grass clipping, leaves and wood chips, dog and cat feces, cardboard boxes and papers or straws, plastic bottles, etc. from entering the drainage inlets and eventually polluting the lake. Grass clippings bring fertilizer and nutrients that feed the algae growth in the water. So the removal of the organic matters results in reduction of the algae."



# **Staying Safe on the Water**

SLOW NO WAKE

Do not operate a boat while under the influence of alcohol. Florida has laws prohibiting operation of a vessel while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The Coast Guard also enforces a federal law prohibiting boating under the influence. That pertains to boats spanning the range from canoes and kayaks to larger ships. Alcohol can impair vision, coordination, balance and judgment, which can be magnified by being on the water. Boating under the influence is unsafe and illegal.

**Enroll in a boating safety class.** Operator errors are preventable with proper training. Yet they are responsible for 70 percent of all boating accidents. The Coast Guard Auxiliary offers an array of classes to help improve your safety I.Q.: http://cgaux.org/boatinged/

**Don't overload your boat.** Evenly distributed weight keeps a boat balanced. On a small boat, resist the urge to have several people check the engine in a small boat as it can easily flip over. Remember that standing and changing seating positions can immediately make the boat less stable making it easier for a wave, wake or sudden turn to send a man overboard or capsize the vessel. Think before you move while underway.

**Focus your attention and designate someone to be your lookout.** A distracted boat driver can lead to an accident. Having a second set of eyes can also help you identify navigational hazards (such as floating logs) and a sudden change in weather. Even a small piece of debris can severely damage your boat at certain speeds and cause injury.

Operate your boat at a safe speed and understand/ obey all signage. When preparing your "float plan," take the time to understand how to read a chart. Taking a boating safety class will also help you understand navigational rules. Obeying posted speeds and no-wake zones help protect you and your crew, other boaters and marine life.

Training classes (http://cgaux.org/boatinged/) and advance preparation can make you a safer boater.


