



is the teenage (17-year-old) son of Jennifer and Rick Brugge of Carrollowood Drive. Along with being an excellent student at Berkeley Prep, he also plays on their golf team and soccer team and is President-elect of the band. So you would assume that his time for other activities would be somewhat limited. Contrary to that supposition, Payson has made time for community work and helping others.

But let's go a step further and go back in his history a little. Payson's dad got into skateboarding as a kid and found it to be a lot of fun, so it was only natural, he wanted to expose Payson to the same enjoyment as a very young kid. But along with the enjoyment of doing this at the Skatepark of Tampa, they both began to volunteer with the Skatepark's official charity that donates skateboards to local underprivileged youth called Boards For Bros.

After years of volunteering, Payson founded his own non-profit, tax-exempt organization with the goal of expanding skateboarding activities for impoverished kids called The Ollie Plan. I'm sure that many of you like me wonder what 'Ollie" is. Well, it's a maneuver used by skateboarders that serves as a foundation for many other tricks. That was a way to emphasize the purpose of

his charity as a foundation for the development for life skills. For the charity's first event, he partnered with two other charities, The Concrete Jungle Foundation and Boards For Bros. Concrete Jungle builds skateparks around the world in impoverished areas to give the kids an opportunity to develop physical and social skills for some of the world's poorest. But you need skateboards, and they are not cheap. Boards For Bros helps out in the states, but what about these other underserved places? So, Payson began his work. His initial goal was to raise enough money to buy and ship 300 skateboards to Peru in support of several skateparks The Concrete Jungle Foundation has built there.

As you probably know, Peru is on the state department's list of places Americans should not travel to at this time. However, Payson was not going to let his plan fail so during his spring break he went to Peru going to remote villages and giving out skate boards to kids in need of some fun and social growth in their lives. It also gives them a reason to stay in school as some of the programs are incorporated with after school education.

He's not done yet. There are other countries on his list, and you can contribute to his community work and his charity at www.theollieplan. org. There are no salaries going to anyone. As a board member, I am delighted to have the opportunity to support this extremely important charity. Let's join together to support our Original Carrollwood young people.




Graduation Logic Puzzle



# What's the Future of Adams Middle School?

As we have all heard, there are changes taking place in the schools around our community. As of when this was written at the end of March, we are still awaiting final approval, but for elementary, it looks as if Carrollwood will become a K-8 school. With systemic challenges at our zoned middle school, it has been proposed that Adams Middle School close at the end of the next school year 2024-2025. The school will remain closed for the next two years while it is converted into the Adams College Preparatory Academy. Students affected by the closure will be reassigned to nearby middle schools, including Carrollwood. Finally, Chamberlain will continue it's successful 3DE and Cambridge curriculums in their newly renovated campus and facilities.

More about Adams: When it reopens in the fall of 2027, the Adams College Preparatory Academy will be a middle school packed with advanced and challenging coursework designed to equip students with the skills they need to excel in high school, college, and beyond. With an international studies program and college-level coursework, students will embark on a journey of learning that is both rigorous and rewarding. Junior Achievement is creating a 3DE middle school curriculum that will

feed into Chamberlain's 3DE program. (learn more at www.3deschools.org)

At the proposed Adams College Preparatory, students will experience a well-rounded education through inquiry-based learning, creative exploration in the visual and performing arts, cutting-edge technology, and state-of-the-art science classrooms and labs. Adams students can earn high school credits for courses like Algebra I Honors, Geometry Honors, Biology, and Foreign Language. And, with partnerships with local colleges and universities, students can even get a head start on their college careers.

The Adams College Preparatory Academy will be dedicated to building critical and independent thinkers, and the Entrepreneur pathway is the perfect way to achieve this goal. 3DE is revolutionizing education by creating engaging learning environments that reflect the real world, empowering students with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to succeed. And with partnerships with Junior Achievement and community agencies, students will get hands-on experience working in teams to solve real-world problems. Students will have the opportunity to unlock their full potential at Adams College Preparatory Academy.
