

This being an election year, the month of June was the time to file and qualify to serve on the CRD Board. This is done with the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections Office in downtown Tampa. As with other communities throughout Hillsborough County, each person had to pay a \$25 fee (or collect the signatures of 25 registered CRD voters), in addition to filing financial disclosures annually with the State while serving on the Board.

There are nine positions on the CRD Board, and as indicated below (snapshot from the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections website), eight OC residents have qualified. So, these eight will automatically become elected

at the November General Election, with the ninth position to be appointed at the December CRD Board Meeting. This process of filing with the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections Office has existed since the State Legislature created the CRD back in the early 1970's. Although, for a long period of time, this process had not been followed. This information is posted online for the next five months leading up to the November General Election, just as it was for the 2012 Election.

This Fall: New Boat Decals and Keys

The CRD Board has decided to wait until after Labor Day weekend to issue new boat decals and keys to the boat ramp at White Sands Beach. If you apply and pay between September 7 and October 31, you will be issued the new key and decal at the time of your application (Note: for those who are already on file with the CRD). After Halloween, it will be by appointment only (allow up to two weeks) for your appointment. The cost will be \$45, with additional decals costing \$5 each for families with multiple vessels. Checks or cash only, made payable to the C.R.D.

In short, get your new decal and key by Halloween.

Note: Applications will not be accepted until Wednesday, September 7.



August + Travel = Historic St. AUGUSTine

As school is about to resume, long vacations are in the rearview mirror for families with K-12 age kids. Only a three-hour drive from the Carrollwood Rec Center, St. Augustine offers a manageable, affordable weekend destination for all.

August 28, 1565, the Feast Day of St. Augustine, was the day Don Pedro Menendez de Aviles, arrived off the coast of Florida, sent there by King Phillip II of Spain to explore and colonize the territory. He and his team of 600 soldiers and settlers came ashore at the site of a Timucuan Indian Village and named it St. Augustine.

But let's give credit to Ponce DeLeon who never searched for the Fountain of Youth. He left his governorship of Puerto Rico in 1511 seeking Bimini and landed instead in Florida where he staked a claim for the Spanish Crown, not the fabled wellspring thought to ensure long life.

Thus, St. Augustine was founded 55 years before the Pilgrims landed on Plymouth Rock in Massachusetts and 42 years before the English colony at Jamestown, Virginia, making it the oldest permanent European settlement on the North American continent.

In the 1800's St. Augustine began its renaissance with the arrival of Henry Flagler. The railroad tycoon who constructed several glorious hotels including the Flagler

Hotel (now Flagler College), the Alcazar Hotel (now the Lightner Museum) and the Casa Monica (recently restored and returned to its roots as a beautiful hotel). More moderate accommodations abound with charming bed and breakfast inns near the historic district, national chains such as Days Inn, Best Western and Marriott Courtyard, and oceanfront hotels line the beach which is a stop on the Old

Town Trolley. A three-day pass (\$23 for adults and \$9 for children 6-12) will take you to the main attractions. The Colonial Quarter Museum, Old Jail, Oldest Store Museum, St. Augustine History Museum, Oldest Wooden Schoolhouse. "Old" is the buzzword here and you can find detailed information on the city's website aptly named: www.oldcity.com.

Take a horse-drawn carriage ride or stroll from one fascinating venue to another, hunt through antiques shops, browse art galleries, find the perfect curio along St. George Street and slip into an 18th-century styled British pub, the Bull and Crown Publick House, to dine on authentic fare. Or visit the Taberna del Caballo, an 18th-century styled tavern for light tapas, cold beverages and an intimate atmosphere you won't find anywhere else.

"Beach shack" bites can be found at bayside or oceanfront restaurants or savor haute cuisine in some of the city's opulent dining rooms. For beach lovers, Atlantic beaches offer swimming and surfing on waves our Gulf does not provide. A golfer's dream, great golf courses are scattered throughout the area, including Sawgrass, host of the PGA Players Championship, the Ponce de Leon Golf Course, the oldest in Florida, and the nearby World Golf Village Hall of Fame is worth a stop on the way home.

The St. Paul Parish Council of Catholic Women was planning a day trip but soon realized there is so much in St. Augustine to enjoy, it deserves at least one-to-two overnights. From Spanish Colonization to British rule to Statehood, St. Augustine's long history and varied cultural influences define this unique city. Don't leave without having a cup of water from that famous Fountain!

The Haviland family was the first family to move to Original Carrollwood. They purchased their home on December 23, 1959. Although 'Happy' passed away in 1975, Muriel Veronica Haviland lived in their home on Korina Lane until her death, July 4. She was 102 years

old. "That's quite a remarkable occurrence." says Mickey Jaap, CRD Vice President.

Muriel was honored for being the first and longest residing homeowner in Original Carrollwood at the Original Carrollwood 50th Anniversary party in July, 2009, a three-day extravaganza that attracted over 3,000 people from Original Carrollwood.

When Muriel moved to Original Carrollwood, it was dark and quiet place. The city lights had not yet appeared and you could see many stars over the lake in the night sky. Peacocks were the only sounds to be heard until the sounds of construction crews starting booming. Time marched on and the neighborhood soon grew to be one of the best-known and best-loved communities in the Tampa area. Muriel loved it because she felt safe and she appreciated the care that went into building the homes. She only had to change her roof once in her 52 years!

Muriel was preceded in death by her husband, Harold Haviland, three sons, William, David, and James Haviland, two daughters, Patricia Trigg and Kathleen Reiss, and

one grandchild, Tommy Myers. Survivors include two daughters, Dorothy Haviland (Bobby Hughes) of Tampa and Maureen Myers (Gary) of Odessa, 14 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren, and two great-great grandchildren. The family would like to thank Dr. Fred Rabow and his staff for all the care and support they gave the family and for keeping their mother alive all these years. We'd also like to thank Dr. Karina Billiris-Findlay and her staff for saving her sight and allowing her to see for the last 10 years.

Muriel's secret to her long and happy life was her "faith in God" as she told me a couple years ago at her 100th birthday.

Services were held July 7, 2016, and burial was July 8, 2016. Muriel was such sweet lady, she will be missed by many!

A while back we discussed the

4-Point inspection that is now required by most insurers prior to issuing insurance. But there are some general issues which affect all of us in our Original Carrollwood homes. These are not necessarily required by the insurers but almost certainly will be required repairs by your buyers.

Dryer venting is a serious problem with many homes in Carrollwood. Many of you have dryers that are vented into the attic. That doesn't seem like a bad idea until you evaluate the lint that comes out with the air. Yes, our dryers have lint catchers but some lint can still escape and when it gets into the attic, it becomes a serious fire hazard. Unlike your insulation, which should be protected against fire, lint is very volatile and will burn very fast. You may want to check this out the next time you are in your attic.

Moisture leaks or sweating around pipes often causes damage to drywalls and sometimes leads to black mold intrusion which requires cutting out and replacing drywall. This can usually be prevented with various types of wraps around the sweating pipes. If mold is evident, it won't just go away, so fixing the source of the mold is important and removing it is just as important.

Garage doors should have safety features to prevent injury. For example, when the door closes, the force should be light enough that it will reverse itself if it comes in contact with a foreign object such as a child on a bike. A good way to check for this is to stand outside of your garage and start closure of the door. Sticking your arm across the path of the door should stop and reverse the door direction when it comes in contact with your arm's resistance. There should also be electronic eves on the floor that cause the door to reverse if the light stream is broken.

These are just a couple of items that will require repair after an inspection and before the closing will take place.


