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

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


over 18 years and can't think of a better place to call home.


Ashley is a native Floridian, born and raised in Ocala, FL, a CCA board member and a Realtor®; selling many

When I walked outside Thursday morning after Ian had "mostly"

I went to White Sands Beach last Thursday afternoon to get a jump start on the clean up so as not to be overwhelmed in the morning (my usual raking time). When taking my first load of palm fronds to the street, a truck pulls in and a gentleman and two boys pile out. The next thing I know, they're collecting a pile of fronds from the volleyball court. Another young man comes in on his bicycle and jumps in to help. Then another boy comes walking up and joins the group. Within 10 minutes there was a crew raking, bagging, and hauling debris to the street. Many hands make for light work. Thanks go to Gabe and Julian (and their parents Nick and Cassie Gomez) and Kaden and Luke (and their parents Jamie and Diedre Heggedal) for all of their hard work.

This isn't the only story of neighbors coming together to help each other that day. That sense of community is what makes Original Carrollwood a special place to live. passed by...I was overwhelmed with gratefulness.

The fact that so many of the beautiful trees in our neighborhood were still standing was nothing short of incredible. Our yards were a mess... but the imminent danger had passed.

I could hear the hum of a generator in the background of one of our neighbors that must have lost power. I said a prayer for them & all others in Ian's path.

As I prayed...I praised God for sparing us here from catastrophe damage. Also for providing the state of Florida with the cooler weather as many went without power...and were also dealing with much more than yard clean up.

As I was looking around..I realized that all those beautiful trees had been drastically stripped of their MANY limbs..leaves..and Spanish moss....ALL over the street & yard. I ALSO realized that because of recent health issues...I would NEVER be able to clean it up.

I prayed for assistance...and as my friends & neighbors were texting me to see how I faired Ian...I shared that my yard was a mess...but knew theirs were too.

Miracle #2: By 12 noon...These Original Carrollwood angel's & some

friends from my church came (14 all together) and joyfully pitched in & in 2 &1/2 hours...had cleared the street & my yard of Ian's fury.

The wildest part is that none of them contacted each other to solicit help ..each group of folks from various parts of our neighborhood.. JUST SHOWED UP. ALL at the same time... rakes...brooms...gloves & love in their hearts!!

I don't have to tell you how touched I was.I was overwhelmed with emotion & cried when I opened my door to discover their arrival. What a beautiful surprise!

The experience was similar to an old fashioned "barn raising" in the "old days"... Neighbors coming alongside neighbors in need.

Like they say ... "MANY hands make light work".

I don't know about "light"...there was a LOT of downed limbs...but you get the point..lol.

Thank you Original Carrollwood for yet again proving that you are the BEST neighborhood in all of Tampa. I've been here for 50+ years... wouldn't live anywhere else.

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OC REAL ESTATE

HOW HURRICANE IAN HAS AFFECTED REAL ESTATE TRANSACTIONS

As we all experienced last month with hurricane Ian, we were expecting a direct hit based on meteorologists' predictions. Some of us did have minimal damage and debris cleanup. We have been fortunate Tampa Bay has not truly undergone a severe catastrophic storm (for quite some time). It is unfortunate to have witnessed the devastation in Ft. Myers. Consequently, buyers and sellers who were scheduled to close on their real estate transactions shortly after post-storm have experienced an inconvenience with closing date delays.

Tampa natives state the mounds that were built by the Tocobaga Tribe (hundreds of years ago) have protected us from hurricanes and disastrous storms in the Tampa Bay area. This Tribe resided in small villages between the Gandy and Safety Harbor areas. According to Tampa natives, the Tribe has blessed their mounds from major natural disasters. However, no one has been able to validate this legend. To counter this validation, the only hurricane recorded to have had a direct hit on the Tampa Bay area making landfall in Clearwater, Florida, occurred 174 years ago named as the, "Great Gale of 1848."

Although we dodged the bullet yet again, the entire state of Florida was declared as a "disaster zone" according to FEMA, and was lifted Sunday, 10/09/2022. In the AS-IS FAR/BAR purchase agreement contract, there is a clause that discusses force majeure. In laymen's terms, force majeure relates to hurricanes, floods, extreme weather, wars, terrorism, pandemics (i.e. – COVID-19), etc. and/or any other acts of God. In result, this would prevent the buyer(s) and seller(s) to not have an obligation to perform or become liable for damages if there is a disruption or delay with availability to services. These would include any lender requirements pertaining to insurance or any essential approvals required to close on the transaction.

Per the AS-IS FAR/BAR contract there is a clause that states, "All time periods affected by the force majeure event, including closing date, will be extended a reasonable time up to seven days after the force majeure event no longer prevents performance under this contract; provided, however, if such force majeure event no longer continues to prevent performance under this contract more than 30 days beyond closing date, then either party may terminate this contract by delivering written notice to the other and the deposit shall be refunded to buyer, thereby releasing buyer and seller from all further obligations under this contract."

This seven-day period is somewhat ambiguous, as this

effective length of time begins once performance is allowed to be exercised by all parties involved in the transaction without any restrictions or disruptions to obtain essential approvals in order to close (i.e. - in this particular instance, once FEMA lifts their restrictions). From my seller's upcoming transaction in Original Carrollwood was expected to close on Monday, 10/03. We executed the first closing date extension to Monday, 10/10, and now the second extension (hopefully the last extension) to Friday, 10/14 (as of The Caroler deadline). We received the clear to close (CTC) earlier than we projected on Monday, 09/19, meaning all lender's required conditions have been fulfilled and the transaction is ready to close. The CTC was retracted and placed back into an 'approved with conditions' status until a satisfactory re-inspection has been performed by an appraiser per lender requirements and FEMA regulations in order to fund the loan. However, this can only be performed once FEMA lifts their restrictions. This process is required to ensure there has not been any damage caused to the property according to their "Natural Disaster Procedure." Fortunately, all parties are eager to close on this particular transaction and all parties are diligently working together well to arrive at the closing table.

It's important to keep in mind for those who plan to buy or sell real estate in the future, there are many moving parts and multiple parties working together to complete all contractual steps/contingencies and met all deadlines throughout a real estate transaction. We are fully aware buying and/or selling real estate can be a stressful and emotional process, but our day-to-day role as a realtor is to do our best to alleviate any unnecessary stress, and sometimes we must act as therapist when emotions come into play. Even the most qualified seasoned realtors cannot prevent all obstacles that can arise, but there are some things that come up that are out of our control. As for the professional and experienced realtors, please always remember, we do try our best to work amicably together with all parties to ensure a smooth and seamless transaction. The ultimate goal is to achieve a win-win scenario for all parties to end up fully content at the finish line. We aspire for all parties to walk away from that closing table with pearly white smiles on their faces.

What's So Special About Yoga?

Yoga is everywhere in so many forms - some prefer it as a workout and others practice to assist in meditation. Let's dive into what yoga is and why it is a fantastic tool for your overall health.

Yoga was created thousands of years ago and the root of the word "Yoga" means "to unite." In yoga, we seek to create harmony between the mind and body. Once this harmony is reached, you are said to reach Bliss or Zen - a state of inner strength and lightness at once - a euphoria of sorts.

While it can take many years of practice to reach a lasting sense of Bliss, you can capture bits of it on a Tuesday in a yoga class and then take that feeling out into the rest of your day. Imagine how you can show up in the world, with a keener focus, resilient body, and kinder heart!

The Yoga that we see is just one part of the 8 "limbs" of the philosophical system of Yoga. It is the asana or physical practice of moving into different poses which can strengthen & stretch, enhance flexibility and balance on the outside and help balance your thoughts and emotions on the inside.

While practicing asana, you release your mind's usual "chatter" about work, kids, and other thoughts and begin to drop the thoughts into the body. Whether your chosen class incorporates sequential movements (called a Flow or Vinyasa) or if the poses are more static (found in Hatha, Iyengar, Restorative, Yin), the end result is the same - a more healthy and well-cared for body and mental state.

In addition, the constant refocusing of your thoughts through movement and breath work can help you to uncover truths about yourself. A clarity comes through practice and often inspires people to discover their talents and purpose.

In a world filled with distractions and so much mental stimulation, it can bring great peace to incorporate a Yoga practice into your daily or weekly habits. By building outer and inner strength, enhancing mental clarity and emotional stability, we can truly pursue our dreams and positively effect the world around us.

Tai Chi Makes a Positive Impact

With all that's been happening in our world over the last 2.5 years, I felt compelled to write about some classes that are making a huge positive impact on many folks' lives. As a senior rehab nurse, I realize the importance of slow-moving exercises to improve balance, flexibility, coordination, strength, and overall health to reduce potential fall risk. I joined the Tai Chi and Qigong classes for health offered by Certified Instructor Suzanne Chen at Grace Lutheran Church (in a large air-conditioned room) Mondays and Thursdays from 10-11 a.m. right here in our neighborhood near the intersection of Dale Mabry Highway and Linebaugh Avenue (3714 W. Linebaugh Ave, Tampa, FL 33618). We practice guided-breathing, Qigong warm-up movements, balance exercises, Tai Chi moves and the formal Yang Style Tai Chi Long-Form (Part 1) with the beautiful intention of easy, fluid movements for greater balance and health. This teacher is very careful with your form, and practices for maximum safety. These exercises serve to build bone density, and are excellent for reducing tension and stress. The breathing exercises help us to breathe deeper for greater oxygen exchange. This is mindful movement that is excellent for developing focus and improving memory as we learn our routines. We have beautifully named movements like wuji, single whip, horse stance, grasping the sparrow's tail, brush knee series, cloud hands, parting the horse's mane, bear swimming, white crane spreads its wings, and repulse monkey/retreat step back! Since joining the class, my overall balance and walking have improved dramatically. My breathing is deeper and more controlled. This class is open to any age adult who can stand for one hour (unassisted), although she does offer customized classes for those who have different health needs. I am in a class with people in their 50s to 80s! Her classes are \$8/class, and she can be reached at schen4000@gmail.com for more information. I made this an investment in my continuing health and attend whenever my work schedule allows. This is a wonderful and encouraging group of people, several of whom are Original Carrollwood Residents. Come join in on the fun. You will be glad you did! As Instructor Suzanne Chen says, "Always walk in peace and harmony for greater balance and health".

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
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
