

TRAVEL IMPRESSIONS Skiing this side of the Alps: Good, Better, Best!

"Sweater weather" have you thinking you'd like to trade your water skis for snow skis?

There are options for whatever age, skill level and budget category you inhabit. Former USF President John Lott Brown (who lived on McFarland Road) took up the sport at age 50. He introduced me to Winter Park, Colorado, figuring if their famous school (Nationall Sports Center for the Disabled) could teach the handicapped to ski, well...

Closest to home is Beech Mountain, NC, a convenient 10.5 hour drive from Tampa. Very family-oriented, the slopes are welcoming and less intimidating than peaks to the north and west. OC resident, Erika Freifeld, suggests this area for an intro to skiing. Laid back with southern hospitality, designer gear and couture are rarely seen in unpretentious Beech Mountain. Man-made snow is the norm, however.

For the not-so-novice, Vermont is a ski destination worth its powder. Imagine a post card setting of Swiss chalets nestled into sugar-coated pines, and you could put the stamp on Stowe, VT, home of the Trapp Family Lodge. Stowe offers excellent snow conditions from November through March. Foodies who prefer creative cuisine to downhill thrills can find a staggering array of taste treats such as Swiss fondue, cheddar fritters and maple syrup apps, desserts and even craft ales; only one hour from Burlington Airport with a stop at Ben and Jerry's en route.

Taking your game a notch higher - to 9,000 ft.+ altitude - the Rockies deserve the recognition as Skiers' Paradise. Distance from a main airport served by Tampa flights: Salt Lake's Park City, Utah, and Denver's Winter Park are all driveable in less than two hours from baggage claim.



Winter Park is "Main Street, USA" - charming pubs, more condo-type accommodations than high-priced resorts found in Vail or Aspen. And Coca-Cola opened a new tubing park there for the snowboard-reluctant.

Feel the crunch of snow under your feet and winter's kiss on your cheeks. Then return to the Palm trees of Lake Carroll Way. No better apres-ski for me!

Other Schefflera neighbors also put out beautiful light displays and decorations in their yards each year. In the third year, the Brantleys and Good/Potters added a lighted peacock between the Brantley and Good/Potter houses. This was particularly special because it is the symbol of our neighborhood, and the families hope to add more of them!




